Objective:

The objects of the Charity are as follows:

Trinity Care Foundation is a public health Organization focused on enhancing the public health programs effectiveness, strengthening the community health programs by reaching out to the socially and economically underprivileged sections of the society both in rural and urban India.

1. To establish complete care center for patients suffering from facial deformities and to provide free or low cost surgical care to patients from low socio-economic background, born or suffering from with oral or facial surgical defects.
2. To provide health care such as, health check-up, treatment and surgical intervention for children covered by the sponsorship programmes or supported by community based rehabilitation programmes.
3. To provide medical help in all possible and suitable manner depending upon circumstances and situation to poor, deserving persons of the weaker section of the society.
4. To provide education to children, women and other disadvantaged groups of the society.
5. To undertake welfare activities including medical and diagnostic camps and treatment for patients from low socio-economic background.

Policies

Funding Sources

The Charity is financially supported by donations from general public, social organization and corporate grants.

Memberships

The Charity is open to the public for participation in its charitable activities in helping the social needy. School Health Screening, Facial Deformity Surgeries, Outreach Health Programs and Education Programs are conducted for the public in pursuing of the objects of the Charity.

Review of Year 2020-2021

Staffing

As at 31.03.2021, there are 9 full-time and 12 part-time administrative staffs employed by the Charity.

Activities

Covid19 Relief:

1. Free 44 Medical Camps for Frontline workers focusing on Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) [Testing GRBS, BP, ECG, Medical Consultation and Medications] 2947 individuals [Police Personnel, Pourakarmikas, Cocoon Market Farmers and Workers, general public.]

Authorization to conduct Community Medical Camps was given by Chikkabalapura and Bangalore Rural District – District Collectors.

2. Free 4 Medical Camps for Government Teachers focusing on NCDs [Testing GRBS, BP, ECG, Eye Testing, Medical Consultation and Medications] 464 Teachers and School Staff.

Medical Check-up, NCDs Testing, Eye/Vision and ECG Testing. Free Medications were provided.

3. Free 4 Community Medical Camps for General Public focusing on NCDs [Testing GRBS, BP, ECG, Eye Testing, Medical Consultation and Medications]

564 Individuals, 119 Free Spectacles distributed.

4. Provided Free PPE Kits, Masks, Sanitizers, Gloves, N95 Masks to Government Hospitals in Bangalore, Bangalore Rural and Chikkaballapur Districts.

N95 Masks – 350 Numbers.

PPE Kits – 740 Number.

3 ply Masks – 630 Number.

Sanitizers -500ml – 150 bottles.

Surgical Gloves – 100 Gloves -60 Boxes.

Sodium Hypochlorite Solution – 75 Litres

School Health Program – A comprehensive preventative healthcare program for underprivileged students in Government and Government-aided schools in Karnataka State, India focusing on health screening, health education, providing health kits, treatments and follow-up.

Authorization to conduct School Health Medical Camps was given by Ramanagara ZP CEO.

5347 Students undergone Health Check-up, Health Education, Vision Testing, BMI Calculated, Health Education Provided, Face-Masks Provided, Covid19 Booklet provided.

Provided Free Comprehensive Health Check-up, Health Education, Referral and follow-up of Government/Govt. Aided School Students in 56 schools supported by Companies.

Provided 239 spectacles to needed school students, 5347 Face-Masks to students.

Health Education about Covid19 Awareness Sessions to 56 Schools along with a IEC Material Covid19 Booklet distributed to all 5347 students and Teachers.

Government Primary Health Centre(PHC) Support: For the Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan, we supported Byramangala PHC by providing free health check-ups to pregnant women by gynecologist and Dentist Conducted 3 Mammography screening camps at the PHC for the underserved communities.

Pragthali Shaale Project: Empowering 13 Government Schools in Sarjapura Hobli, Anekal Taluk. Education and Healthcare Programs for the students of the Schools.

Safe Drinking Water Project - Providing safe drinking water to students by maintenance of the installed RO Water plants in 14 Government schools in rural Karnataka state, India.

Adolescent School Health Education Programme (S.H.E) - The School health education programme provides age-appropriate, uniform skilled advice on nutrition, prevention of anaemia, hygiene (menstrual), problems of growing years, career counselling to school girls and for older girl's sessions on avoiding RTI/STIs was conducted in 56 Government Schools for unprivileged girl students. The objective of S.H.E programme will be to Impart knowledge to adolescent girls in low- and middle-income age groups (1) about menstruation and how prepared are they for reaching menarche, (2) who are their sources of information regarding menstruation, (3) how well do the adults around them respond to their

information needs, (4) what negative health and social effects do adolescents experience as a result of menstruation, and (5) how do adolescents respond when they experience these negative effects and what practices do they develop as a result.

Future Plans and Commitments:

The Charity planned to enter into a partnership with Education Department, Government of Karnataka to set up Solar Enable Computer Literacy Program in Government Schools in Ramanagara District.

The School Health Programme will be extended to cover at least 15,000 students from the Government schools and will work towards promoting safe drinking water through installing and maintain good quality RO water systems in the Govt. schools which will provide healthy options for the students and teaching staff.

Infrastructure development for Government schools i.e. providing technical systems and Initial computer lab installations will be extended to other districts in Karnataka state, India.

The Charity has planned to implement an Oral Health Program in Ramanagara District with focus on Health Education, Dental Check-ups and Dental Treatments for Government School Students.

During the Pandemic, the Charity plans to provide medical services to the General Public along with Covid19 Vaccination in rural Karnataka.




